# Delhi MCDs inaugurate over 60 projects within three months

THE THREE municipal corporations of Delhi, headed for polls on April 23, have inaugurated over 60 projects in the last three months at a total cost of over Rs 744 crore.

Between January 1 this year and March 14, when the model code of conduct came into force, the three MCDs have inaugurated long-pending projects such as a disaster management centre, 16 schools (mostly primary), seven community centres, two stadiums and a mini stadium.

The biggest project among these is the Narela-Bawana waste-to-energy plant, built at a cost of Rs 458 crore and inaugurated by Union Urban Development Minister Venkaiah Naidu on March 10. Before January this year, only a single project — a digitisation initiative — was launched in December and no projects were launched in November.

Although finances of at least two out of the three corporations have been a matter of concern for over a year — with both the North and East corporations struggling to pay salaries to its employees — they have spent Rs 605.91 crore and Rs 19.86 crore on 40 projects respectively.

The inaugurations mostly concern infrastructure projects, and include several projects that were completed in a last-minute push for development as the BJP's five-year term ends on April 31. These include newly constructed recreation centres, poly-clinics, parking spaces and more.

While MCD office bearers from the ruling party admit to the last-minute push for developmental projects, they also insist that many of these projects have been in the pipeline and were nearing completion.

"At the end of the term, there are councillor funds and other discretionary funds that are spent on various projects. Commissioners also have funds that are distributed for various projects," said Prawesh Wahi,

Chairman, standing committee in the North Delhi Municipal Corporation.

Standing committee chairman in the South, Shailender Singh Monty, said since bigger projects take longer time for various clearances, many have been inaugurated towards the end of the financial year. Meanwhile, the opposition has called it "a last-minute effort to dupe the

people." Leader of the Opposition in the South, Farhad Suri, said that they (ruling BJP) made no investments in infrastructure in the last five years, and "then they realised they are nearing the end of their tenure, they have gone on a spree of inaugurations".

Projects in the South include a new West Zone Headquarters, open gyms, a science museum,

dog sterilisation centres and two multi-level parkings.

# Airline mulls 'no fly' list of unruly passengers

SHIV SENA MP Ravindra Gaikwad, who assaulted an Air India staff on board a Pune-Delhi flight, may not be able to fly with the national carrier again as the airline is thinking of preparing a no-fly list for unruly passengers — which will feature Gaikwad.

"Air India is examining the creation of a no-fly list of unruly passengers, along the lines of other carriers," a senior airline official said.

Gaikwad, who was flying on an Air India flight from Pune to Delhi, allegedly hit the airline's duty manager Shivkumar with his slipper several times after the staffer asked him to deboard at the Delhi airport.

Recently, there have been several reported incidents of unruly behaviour by fliers onboard various airlines. Last month, AirAsia India filed a police complaint in

Bangalore against two drunk fliers for creating "nuisance" onboard one of its flights. In January, IndiGo was forced to tie down a passenger to his seat for being violent onboard its flight from Dubai for New Delhi.

According to officials, between July 2016 and February 2017, as many as 53 incidents of unruly behaviour by passengers have been reported by domestic

airline companies. According to the global aviation body, International Air Transport Association (IATA), "unruly passengers" are one of the top three safety issues that concern cabin crew. As per the IATA, in 2015, there were 10,854 reported cases of unruly behaviour by passengers across airlines worldwide — which is one incident for every 1,205 flights.

# 'Anti-Romeo squads' arrive in Noida

A DAY after 32 men were detained by "Anti-Romeo squads" in Ghaziabad, the teams reached Gautam Buddha Nagar district of Noida on Thursday evening. Comprising men and women police personnel, the teams went to marketplaces and educational institutes to check instances of harassment.

On Thursday, the squads were formed in each police station of the district on orders issued by the Uttar Pradesh police headquarters. "We have decided to form Anti-Romeo Squads in every police station. Each squad will have five police personnel. It will comprise three women and two male constables. Wherever there are women sub-inspectors, they would lead the

team," Dharmendra Singh, SSP, Gautam Buddha Nagar, said.

As per the order, all public places such as crossroads, malls and parks, "need to be made free of anti-social elements". Police were further directed to ensure that these squads comprise women constables in plain clothes, the order said.

In the run-up to the UP Assembly polls, setting up the squads was one of the key promises made by the BJP. On Wednesday, six young men were issued challans under CrP Section 151 in Vijay Nagar area of Ghaziabad.

"A warning was issued to them. They had been roaming near ABES College where they were questioned and later brought to the police station. They were let off with a warning," Neeraj Kumar Singh, SHO, Vijay Nagar police station, said.

# Two arrested for duping buyers of Rs 20 crore: Police

Noida: The head of a construction firm and his associate were arrested Thursday for duping home buyers of nearly Rs 20 crore — by selling the same flats to multiple people.

According to police, six months ago, they had received a complaint from a person who had invested in AVJ Heights Housing Society in Greater

Noida's Zeta-1 sector. "The complainant alleged that the flat bought by him was sold to others by the builder and they had taken loans from different banks. An FIR against the builder and his associates was filed," said Anuj Verma, SHO, Surajpur police station.

"The accused maintained that he was being framed in the case," an officer said. ENS

# Doctors' body calls for strike at pvt, govt hospitals today

EVEN AS resident doctors from government hospitals went on mass leave on Thursday in support of their counterparts in Maharashtra who are on strike, the Delhi Medical Association (DMA) has called for a strike at both private and government hospitals Friday.

However, the association said in-patient services and the emergency ward will remain functional. Meanwhile, doctors will wear black armbands to work in a show of solidarity.

Sir Gangaram Hospital, in a statement said, OPD services will be shut Friday. "Our hospital expresses solidarity with the concerns of Indian Medical Association and DMA regarding the safety of doctors. General and private OPDs of our hospital will not function tomorrow. However, in-patient as well as emergency

services will function normally," said Dr DS Rana, chairman, Board of Management, Sir Gangaram Hospital.

On Thursday, OPD services were hampered in the morning due to the mass leave but emergency services were unaffected.

"Even though resident doctors were on mass leave, some helped out in the emergency ward throughout the day. While services were hit significantly in the operation theatre, no other services were affected," said Pankaj Solanki, Federation of Resident Doctors Association president — an umbrella body of residents doctors in Delhi.

At Lok Nayak Jai Prakash (LNJP) Hospital, resident doctors were on leave between 9am and 4pm. Dr J C Passey, medical director, said while emergency services remained functional, the OPD was not functioning at its full strength as only senior doctors reported for duty. "No amount of security

measures can guarantee that what happened in Maharashtra will not happen here. The general public needs to realise that doctors are overworked and that we cannot save everyone," he added.

FORDA added that they might go on indefinite mass leave after Saturday if the Maharashtra government does not act according to their demands. The DMA has also planned to carry out a protest march at Maulana Azad Medical College on Friday.

"Incidents of assault on doctors are rising everyday... Patients and their relatives are taking the law into their hands, which is not acceptable," DMA state secretary Dr Ashwani Goyal said.

There have been several instances of doctors being beaten up by attendants of patients in Delhi over the past few years. The latest incident was reported from Deen Dayal Upadhyay Hospital in March last year, when two doctors were beaten up by attendants of an accident victim.
